Sessions will be, to a certain extent, child led and once established, the children will play a large part in choosing and creating activities.

Activities may be changed or adapted if the weather is not suitable.

Children will need to bring torches in the darker months.

Children will need to be prepared for the weather- suitable footwear for running in wet and muddy conditions and waterproof clothing (just in case!).

Parents are not required to attend the sessions with their children. All activities are run by two of our experienced Field Teachers who are DBS checked and First Aid qualified. Cambridge Past, Present & Future holds a Learning Outside the Classroom Quality Badge. Each year we welcome over 2,000 school children to Wandlebury to learn in the outdoors.

Activities are based from our Stables Education Centre and private paddock at the heart of the beautiful Wandlebury Estate on top of the Magog Hills, on the southern edge of Cambridge, CB22 3AE. We have toilets and hand-washing facilities.
